Our Railway portrays an era when steam train travel was central to most people's lives. Much of our heritage rolling stock is unique and forms a collection of national importance.

The origin of The Isle of Wight Steam Railway dates back to 1965 when a small group of enthusiasts had the vision to save a little piece of Island railway history. That early vision has developed into an award-winning living museum operating historic steam trains over 5 miles of track on about 200 days per year ...

The Vision - To Save a Piece of Island Railway History

The first railway in the Isle of Wight opened in 1862. In their heyday, the Island railways boasted a network of 55 miles; but from the 1950s the Island's once vibrant network of lines began closing. By the end of steam in 1966 only 8 miles from Ryde to Shanklin remained. At this point a small group of enthusiasts had the vision to save and preserve one of the remaining O2 class locomotives and six historic carriages. These formed the nucleus of what we have today.

The Journey Begins

The Isle of Wight Steam Railway started life at Havenstreet in 1971, with 1 1/2 miles of track, a platform, a small station building and very little else! During the next two decades two more former Island locomotives were acquired and new facilities were built. In the 1980s a programme of rebuilding Victorian coaches from grounded bodies began, and the Railway now has an enviable collection of historic carriages.

Extension

In 1991, the Railway was extended to an interchange station with Island Line at Smallbrook Junction. Since then, new or refurbished boilers have been obtained for our three Island locomotives to ensure their long-term future, five more historic steam locomotives have been donated to the Railway, and a Heritage Lottery Funded carriage and wagon workshop has been built.



With our Strategic Vision setting-out our aspirations for the future, there has never been a more exciting time to come and join us!

The Way Ahead
 In 2009 the Railway published a 'Strategic Vision' outlining our aspirations for the next twenty years. This includes new visitor reception facilities, an enhanced mechanical engineering works and a storage building for our historic rolling stock. We also aspire to extend to Ryde St Johns and to restore the station at Ashley and in the very long term we may construct a replica Island locomotive. The Strategic Vision is fully reviewed and updated every three years.

Train Story

Our £1.2 million Discovery Centre opened to visitors in 2014. A combination of fundraising, volunteer input and a Heritage Lottery Fund grant made this venture possible.
